

Recital Ticket Sales Instructions

Saturday, May 3- Priority Online Ticket Sales

- There will be a limit of 8 tickets per show (per family) on this day.
- To purchase tickets, enter your priority code during your time frame. Your code will not work before your specific time frame. (*Priority codes will go home with dancers the week of April 28.*)

8:30-Company & 10 Year Dancers 9:30- 6-9 Year Dancers 10:30- 5 Year Dancers 11:30- 2, 3 & 4 Year Dancers 12:30- 1st Year Dancers

Monday, May 5- Recital Tickets are Open to Public/Additional Tickets Available starting at 11 a.m. (when the Columbia box office opens)

• No limit on the number of tickets you can purchase! You do not need a priority code.

Recital Ticket Prices are \$12 per ticket. All ticket sales will be online. Tickets will not be sold at the door on recital day.

Additional Information:

-Children, under the age of 2, that will sit in your lap do not need a ticket.

-Handicap seats are available. If you need a wheelchair seat, please contact Columbia ticketing directly at 985-549-2999. -You may pay for tickets with Visa/MasterCard/Discover/American Express.

-No one is allowed to purchase tickets until they have a zero balance on their account. This includes tuition, recital fee and all costume expenses.

Online Instructions from the Columbia Theater:

- The link that the parents need is this:

- Once they follow the link, they click on "buy tickets" for whichever show they want.
- Select Seat/ it will then ask for their code and will only let them get 8, then click **close** which brings them back to where they can select the other show (if they are buying for both)
- They select seats for other show, enter 2nd code and then checkout. It will ask at checkout if they want edelivery or mailed tickets. There is a 2.00 fee to mail. (It shows that online-just wanted to let you know.)
- A lot of people don't look closely and buy at the top of chart, not even noticing they are buying last row on balcony or last row of orchestra.
